

So, what are digital skills?



Until the Digital Competence Framework for Educators carried out by European Commission came to put things in order.

This Framework consists of six competence areas in three levels concerning the acquisition of 22 competences. These numerous competences clearly indicate the complex role of educators. Through the dedication of their teaching practice, they have a responsibility to pass on their expertise as well as digital competences for life and employability to their aspired learners.
